

The Don'ts

Many Items are labeled with the familiar recycling symbol, however, this does not mean that it is recyclable in our blue box program. The recycling symbol often means that the item has been made out of recycled material but is not recyclable in our program.



If you turn your plastic containers upside down, you will usually find the plastic identified by a number inside the recycling symbol. If there is a #1 or #2 inside the symbol and/or the letters PETE or HDPE underneath it you can recycle it in our program

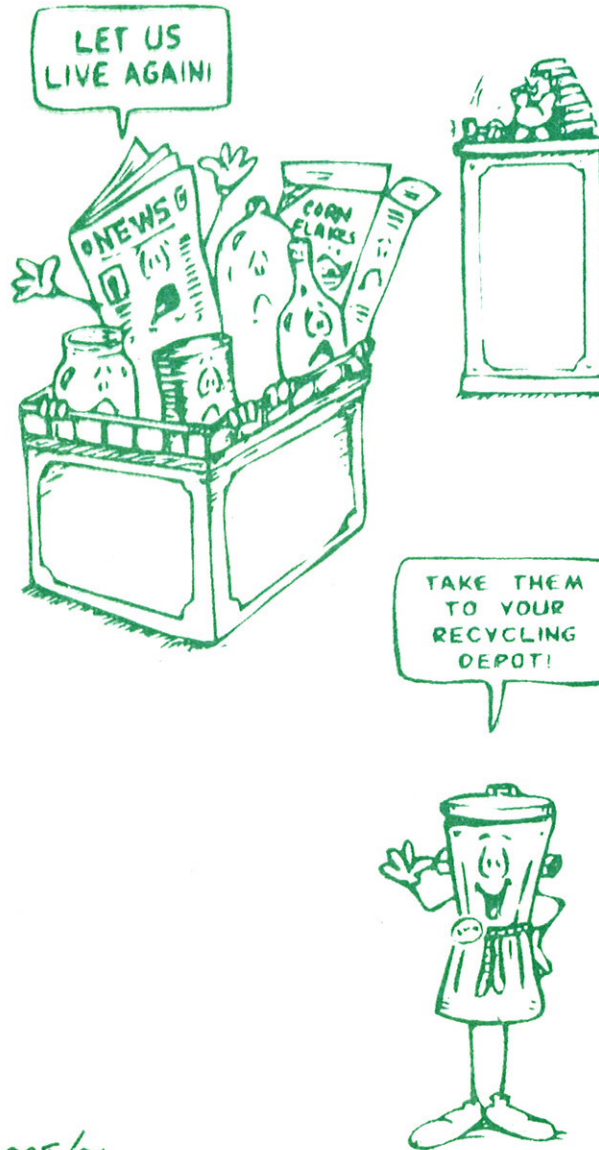
Some exceptions to the #2 plastic that we can not accept in our program includes:

- ◆ Motor Oil Bottles
- ◆ Pesticide & Herbicide containers
- ◆ Wide mouth containers (tubs). e.g.. Margarine, Yogurt, & Ice Cream and 20 litre pails

Please do not deposit:

- Tissues or paper towels
- Drinking glasses
- Window pane glass, ceramics, & china
- Light bulbs
- Plastics other than #1 PETE or #2 HDPE
- Coat hangers (plastic or metal)

Glass Bottles & Jars

In our recycling program we collect only glass bottles and jars.

When other glass items, such as window pane glass, drinking glasses, light bulbs, ceramics, & china are mixed in with the bottles and jars, our load of glass becomes contaminated and thus not saleable. If we can not sell the materials then we have defeated the purpose of recycling

- Please rinse the bottles and jars to remove any food or residue left in the container.
- Please remove lids from bottles and jars.
- You do not have to remove labels from glass containers.

Commingled Plastic & Metal Food & Beverage Containers

In our recycling program we collect the following "commingled" materials

This "commingled" category includes:

- Steel (tin) food & beverage cans.
- Aluminum food and beverage cans.
- Aluminum trays and foil (must be clean)
- #1 PETE & #2 HDPE Plastic food and beverage containers

These materials are all deposited in the same depot bin.

- **Please Remove the caps and lids** from all plastic bottles. For metal cans, push the lid inside after rinsing and squeeze the top of the can slightly to keep the lid in.
- **Please rinse the cans and containers** to remove any food or residue left in the container.
- **You do not have to remove labels** from the containers.

Cardboard & Boxboard ONLY

- Please No plastic or wax board
- Please flatten all boxes

- Newspaper & flyers
- Magazines & catalogues
- Telephone books
- Paper/Hard Cover books
- Writing paper & envelopes
