COUNCIL AND STAFF REPORTS

Clerk's Report:

Clerk/Administrator Tonelli spoke to her report respecting: Elk Damage Compensation; Christmas Lighting; and Automatic doors installation at Municipal Office. She also spoke to recent information received regarding an advertisement circulated by a ratepayer asking for student volunteers to conduct a clean-up in Little Rapids area, noting that the ratepayer has been advised that if the work to be done is on municipal property, she must provide the names of the students. Mrs. Tonelli also spoke to the delay in the installation of the Arena Fire Alarm System. She reported that the Fire Department has authorized the arena volunteers to commence ice making during the installation should weather conditions allow.

On a query from Councillor Eldner regarding a request from a ratepayer, Clerk and Mayor recommended that the request be submitted in writing for Council consideration.

Planning Report:

Deputy Clerk Eagleson's report entitled "Minor Variance Application Roll 18-09503 Set Public Meeting Date", respecting Item 8-5 was referenced.

Public Works Report:

Public Works Superintendent Dumont's report dated December 14, 2011 was provided to Council. The report addressed the following: completion of ditching on Feltham Road and advisement of request for future winter maintenance over a section of said road; Meakin Logging operations over the portion of Melwel Road and Dunn Farm Trail that is not winter maintained; drainage problems and resultant extra expenditure on Melwel Road due to beaver activity; the near completion of work on Ingram Road near Pine Ridge Road intersection as scheduled in the 2011 Five Year Plan; and additional maintenance required on municipal roads including Basswood Lake Road due to the fluctuating temperature/weather conditions. Superintendent Dumont has also been advised of the timeline for work on the Mississagi River Bridge on Highway 17 in Iron Bridge.
