

**THE CORPORATION OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF HURON SHORES
(11-26)**

Wednesday, October 12, 2011

A Special Meeting of the Council of the Corporation of the Municipality of Huron Shores was held on Wednesday, October 12th, 2011, and called to order by Mayor Gil Reeves at 7:00 p.m.

AGENDA REVIEW

Mayor Reeves advised that this special meeting was being held under the requirements of the Planning Act, for the purpose of implementing a Temporary Use Zoning By-law. Deputy Clerk Eagleson will be Acting Clerk in the absence of Clerk/Administrator Tonelli.

DECLARATION OF PECUNIARY INTEREST

There were no declarations of pecuniary interest.

Mayor Reeves advised that the meeting was being held as required under the Planning Act in response to an application received to request temporary use of properties described as PCL 2945 ACS and PCL 4560 ACS in Concession 2 Lot 6 SPT Parts 7 to 12 RP AR224, and PCL 2946 ACS in Concession 2 Lot 6 SPT, Gladstone Township, to permit a "Garden Suite" (Granny Flat).

Mayor Reeves advised that if anyone desired to make a presentation or provide comments in support of or in objection to the application they could now come forward and do so.

Veronica Hanlon, the applicant, advised that she and her mother Elizabeth Eckle were in favour of the application.

There was one question from Council querying whether this application contravened any current municipal by-laws. Acting Clerk Eagleson advised Planning Consultant Bill Wierzbicki had provided comment on the application in that he could see no contravention of the current Official Plan. She also advised that the former trailer by-law for the former Iron Bridge area was no longer in place, having expired with the amalgamation sunset clause with regard to by-laws of the former municipalities.

Mayor Reeves advised that he would allow an additional five minutes should someone else desire to make presentation or comment on the matter.

No further comments or objections to the amendment application.

Acting Clerk Eagleson advised that there had been no verbal or written comments received regarding this proposal in response to the Notice of Public Meeting previously circulated.

Mayor Reeves advised that this application would be brought forward to the October 26th Regular Meeting of Council for a decision.
