

REPORTING TO THE CARETAKER

Please stop at the entrance to advise the Caretaker as to the type of waste you are depositing. Please recycle whatever and whenever possible.

NEW! ID CARDS & BAG TAGS

The introduction of an Identification Card system and Garbage Bag Tag Limits for Huron Shores residents are being considered. If implemented, ID Cards would have to be shown to the Caretaker in order to access the Municipal Waste Disposal Sites. Public input is welcome. Watch huronshores.ca for further updates.
