NEW! ID CARDS & BAG TAGS

The introduction of an Identification Card
system and Garbage Bag Tag Limits for
Huron Shores residents are being consid-
ered. If implemented, ID Cards would have to
be shown to the Caretaker in order to access the Mu-
nicipal Waste Disposal Sites. Public input is wel-
