DELEGATIONS AND PETITIONS

Mayor Reeves invited Ms. Ina Lila and Ms. Aisha Lewis, of Abundant Solar Energy Inc., to approach the table. Ms. Lila explained that they were in attendance to request support of Project S.2.1, a Non-Rooftop 500 kW Solar Panel Installation at 14944 Hwy. 17 E. Ms. Lewis provided background information with respect to their company and the FIT program. Ms. Lila spoke to the sight location, size of the project and contract with the owner. Mayor Reeves explained that consideration of their correspondence will be

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held at the October 26 Meeting of Council. Ms. Lila and Ms. Lewis departed Council Chambers at 7:15 p.m.

Mayor Reeves welcomed Wendy Whitemore to the Council table. Ms. Whitemore addressed her request to have Feltham Road maintained on a year-round basis through to its intersection with Walker Road. She drew a picture identifying the location of her property on Feltham Road and the section requiring winter maintenance. Ms. Whitemore expressed several reasons as to why the road should be maintained on a year-round basis. She also addressed the high tax rate and lack of services. Ms. Whitemore responded to a query from Councillor Persia respecting access to power for her property. Mayor Reeves thanked Ms. Whitemore.

WHEREAS recent polling, conducted on behalf of the Association of Municipalities of Ontario (AMO) indicates 76% of Ontarians are concerned or somewhat concerned property taxes will not cover the cost of infrastructure while maintaining municipal services, and 90% agree maintaining safe infrastructure is an important priority for their communities; AND WHEREAS infrastructure and transit are identified by Ontarians as the biggest problems facing their

AND WHEREAS a ten-year projection (2016-2025) of municipal expenditures against inflationary property tax and user fee increases, shows there to be an unfunded average annual need of \$3.6 billion to fix local infrastructure and provide for municipal operating needs;
AND WHEREAS the \$3.6 billion average annual need would equate to annual increases of 4.6% (including inflation) to province-wide property tax revenue for the next ten years;
AND WHEREAS this gap calculation also presumes all existing and multi-year planned federal and provincial transfers to municipal governments are fulfilled;
AND WHEREAS if future federal and provincial transfers are unfulfilled beyond 2015 levels, it would require annual province-wide property tax revenue increases of up to 8.35% for ten years;
AND WHEREAS Ontarians already pay the highest property taxes in the country;
AND WHEREAS each municipal government in Ontario faces unique issues, and the fiscal health and needs are a challenge which unites all municipal governments, regardless of size;
NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the Corporation of the Municipality of Huron Shores supports the **Association of Municipalities of Ontario** in its work to **close the fiscal gap**; so that all municipalities can benefit from predictable and sustainable revenue, to finance the pressing infrastructure and municipal service needs faced by all municipal governments.
