COUNCIL AND STAFF REPORTS

Council Reports

Councillor Jones-Scissons spoke to her attendance at the Tourism Excellence North Workshop **Making your Touring Route the envy of Canada Workshop**, May 15-16/18 in Blind River. The Workshop was to develop a marketing plan to highlight tourism in the area with homework to be done following the workshop. Once completed, Councillor Jones-Scissons will introduce it to Council. She also reported that members of the HNCEA were in attendance and will be adopting this effort as their project. In response to query from Mayor Reeves, Nancy advised of others in attendance.

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Councillor Wedgwood entered Council Chambers at 7:12 p.m.

Councillor Kirby spoke to her attendance, with Councillor Wedgwood, at the **Invasive Species Workshop** in Richards Landing, May 22/18. Superintendent Hadikin and Deputy Clerk Roberts were also in attendance. Councillor Kirby spoke to the Early Detection and Rapid Response network that can be contacted to report possible evidence of an invasive species. Councillor Wedgwood also spoke to the presentation.

Councillor Armstrong spoke to her report provided to Council regarding her attendance at the **Asset Management for Elected Officials Workshop** held May 3/18 in Sudbury. She highly recommended that other members of Council consider attending similar sessions or webinars regarding asset management.

Councillor MacKinnon provided an update on the upcoming **ATV Run** in Little Rapids to be held May 26/18.

Mayor Reeves provided Council with a report with respect to the **2018 FONOM Conference** in Parry Sound, May 9-11/18. He advised of certain presentations of interest. Mayor Reeves also briefly spoke to the deferment of Thessalon First Nation Court proceedings from May 23 to June 27. He reported that he spoke with MMAH representative Jason Innis while at FONOM and travelled to Toronto on May 11th to meet with Mark Richard, land claim negotiator with the Ministry of Indigenous Relations and Reconciliation (MIRR). He addressed with both gentlemen the importance of wood supply to Midway Lumber Mills Ltd. Mayor Reeves advised that he invited Mr. Richard to attend a meeting of Council. Mayor Reeves also reported that he met with Thessalon First Nation Chief Boulrice on May 16th to discuss the wood supply and hand deliver the letter he was instructed to write at the May 9/18 Meeting of Council. He reported that he also spoke with the Ministry of Natural Resources Management Supervisor on May 17th regarding the matter and was advised that operations did resume in a portion of Kirkwood on May 22nd.
