

Background

The Government of Canada is establishing a Canada Water Agency to improve freshwater management across the country. On June 28, 2021, Sault Ste. Marie City Council approved the formation of a Task Force to explore this potential opportunity. The Task Force is developing a pitch to bring the Canada Water Agency to our community, which will incorporate community feedback that will be published in a local 'What We Heard' report.

Why Sault Ste. Marie?

Centrally located within the largest group of freshwater lakes in the world, the City of Sault Ste. Marie's plentiful natural assets, cultural diversity, and local expertise that reaches beyond borders, make it an ideal location for such an Agency.

Community Discussions

The City of Sault Ste. Marie has partnered with the Lake Huron Collaborative's Dr. Elaine Ho-Tassone to lead a series of community discussions. We have scheduled eight events, four of which will be held in-person (maximum 20 participants at each) and four of which are online (maximum 100 participants at each), as follows:
